## The Holonomy Group V. Weyl Space W<sub>4</sub>, First Part\*

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Synopsis. This paper belongs to the series of papers dealings with the holonomy group [3], [4], [5], [6]. It is concerned with the holonomy group of a Weyl space  $W_4$ . It consists of two parts, the first part being the present paper which is divided into three chapters.

In the first chapter we apply previous results to a Weyl space and, besides, we derive some auxiliary results needed later. The second chapter is devoted to general information about possible holonomy groups of a  $W_4$ . Finally, in the third chapter we display a complete classification of holonomy groups in a  $W_4$ .

The second part, to be published later, will contain finite equations of the transformations of holonomy groups of  $W_4$  and the theory of the corresponding group invariants.\*\*

- 1. Previous auxiliary results. In this section we shall summarize briefly some previous results [6] needed in subsequent considerations.
- (a) The connection  $\Gamma_{\lambda}^{\nu}_{\mu}$ . There is always a positive density  $\mathfrak{G}$  of weight p=-2/n known up to a gauge transformation

(1.1) 
$$* \mathfrak{G} = (e)^{2f} \mathfrak{G}$$
 (f real).

Objects invariant by (1.1) are termed f-invariant. Let  $\mathfrak{g}_{\lambda\mu}$  be a symmetric f-invariant tensor density of rank n and of weight p=-2/n. The tensor

$$(1.2) g_{\lambda\mu} = \mathfrak{g}_{\lambda\mu}\mathfrak{G}^{-1}$$

transforms by (1.1) according to

(1.3a) 
$$*g_{\lambda\mu} = (e)^{-2f} g_{\lambda\mu} ,$$

\*\* The range of Greek indices consists of the first n Roman numerals. Latin indices run from 1 to n. German indices run from 1 to n. Possible exceptions to these rules will be explicitly mentioned. The major part of this paper, beginning with Section 4, deals with the case n = 4.
