## A Locally Convex Algebra of Analytic Functions

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Introduction. Let

$$\mathfrak{D}_{R} = \{ z \mid |z| < R \}, \qquad 0 < R \le 1,$$

and let

(2) 
$$\alpha_R = \{ f \mid f \text{ analytic in } \mathfrak{D}_R, f(0) = 0 \}.$$

With the usual addition and scalar multiplication,  $\alpha_R$  is a vector space over the complex field. Let  $\alpha_R$  also be given the topology of uniform convergence on compact subsets of  $\mathfrak{D}_R$ . Such convergence is equivalent to convergence in all of the norms defined by

(3) 
$$||f||_{\nu} = \max |f(z)|, \quad |z| \leq r_{\nu} \quad (\nu = 1, 2, \cdots),$$

where

$$0 < r_{\nu} < R \qquad (\nu = 1, 2, \cdots), \qquad \lim_{\nu \to \infty} r_{\nu} = R.$$

This in turn is equivalent to convergence in the (complete) metric

$$d(f, g) = \sum_{\nu=1}^{\infty} 2^{-\nu} \min \{1, ||f - g||_{\nu}\}.$$

With this structure,  $\alpha_R$  is a locally convex topological vector space, the family of open convex sets

(4) 
$$S_{\nu,\epsilon} = \{f \mid ||f||_{\nu} < \epsilon\} \qquad (\epsilon > 0; \quad \nu = 1, 2, \cdots)$$

being a base for the neighborhood system of zero.

We now define a commutative, associative multiplication, denoted by fg, on  $\alpha_R$  by

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
