## Absolute Parallelism in a Conformally Flat $V_4^*$

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1. Problem to be solved. It is a common knowledge that the four dimensional Riemann space  $V_4$  is conformally flat if and only if its curvature tensor  $K_{\omega\mu\lambda}$ , is of the form

$$(1.1) K_{\omega\mu\lambda\nu} = -g_{\lambda[\omega}K_{\mu]\nu} + g_{\nu[\omega}K_{\mu]\lambda} + K/3g_{\lambda[\omega}g_{\mu]\nu} \neq 0.$$

Here

(1.2) 
$$K_{\mu\lambda} \stackrel{\text{def}}{=} K_{\omega\mu\lambda\nu} g^{\omega\nu},$$
$$K \stackrel{\text{def}}{=} K_{\mu\lambda} g^{\mu\lambda}.$$

The purpose of this short paper is to find necessary and sufficient conditions that a conformally flat  $V_4$  with metric of the signature +2 admits a field of absolute parallel vectors  $v_{\lambda}$ 

(1.3)a 
$$\nabla_{\mu}v_{\lambda} = v_{\lambda}\partial_{\mu}\ln\varphi, \quad \varphi \neq 0 \quad \text{arbitr.}$$

 $(\nabla_{\mu}$  is the symbol of covariant derivative with respect to the Christoffel symbols of the metric tensor.) It will turn out that these conditions may be fully described by the (Weierstrass) characteristic of  $K_{\mu\lambda}$  and by the condition imposed on K.

**Remark** (1.1). We limit ourselves to the case n=4 because it is of particular interest to the Theory of Relativity. The results obtained here may be easily generalized for an arbitrary n.

**Remark** (1.2). An easy inspection shows that (1.3)a is equivalent to

$$(1.4) \nabla_{\mu} u_{\lambda} = 0,$$

for

$$(1.3)b v_{\lambda} = \varphi u_{\lambda} .$$

Therefore, we can limit ourselves to the case (1.4). The equation (1.4) shows

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
