On the Embeddability of Partially Ordered Halfrings

1. Introduction. In this paper we attack the problem of embedding a partially ordered halfring in a partially ordered ring [2]. Clifford [6] summarized related results for semigroups in his invited address before the American Mathematical Society. We give the pertinent definitions for our theory in Section 2, and in Section 3 we prove the main theorem, namely necessary and sufficient conditions that a partially ordered halfring is embeddable in a ring. Examples illustrating many of the points of our theory are given in Section 4.

Our theory is helpful in the study of convex ideals [7] in partially ordered halfrings and Banach halfalgebras [5]. The second author will develop this in a forthcoming paper.

- 2. Preliminaries. For the sake of completeness we repeat the definition of the term semiring in the sense stated by one of the authors in an earlier paper [3].
- **Definition 1.** A semiring S is a system consisting of a set S and two binary operations on S called addition and multiplication such that (a) S together with addition is a semigroup; (b) S together with multiplication is a semigroup; (c) the left and right hand distributive laws a(b + c) = ab + ac and (b + c)a = ba + ca hold in S.
 - **Definition 2.** A halfring [8] is a semiring which is embeddable in a ring.
- **Definition 3.** (H, \leq) is a partially ordered halfring, briefly a p.o. halfring if and only if (a) H is a halfring, (b) H is partially ordered by \leq , (c) $s \leq t$ implies that $s + x \leq t + x$, and (d) $s \leq t$, $x \geq 0$ imply that $sx \leq tx$ and $t \leq t$.
- **Definition 4.** A partial ordering \leq is said to be strongly additive if and only if $s \leq t$ is equivalent to $s + x \leq t + x$.
- **Definition 5.** A partial ordering \leq is said to be strongly multiplicative if and only if for x > 0, $s \leq t$ is equivalent to $xs \leq xt$ and $sx \leq tx$.
