## Degree of Approximation of Spline Interpolation

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1. Introduction. Interpolation procedures by "spline-curves" have been recently investigated by several authors ([1], [2], [3], [4]). The main mathematical interest of spline-curves centres around their properties of interpolation and the minimization of certain norms so that these interpolatory functions are in some sense best approximations to a given function also. Our aim here is to obtain results about degree of approximation by spline curves and thereby improve a result of Ahlberg & Nilson [1]. In §2 we state our main results concerning cubic splines, whose proofs are given in §§3 and 4. In §5 we extend some of our results to piecewise quintic polynomials.

## 2. Convergence of cubic splines. Let

$$(2.0) 0 = x_0 < x_1 < \dots < x_m = 1$$

be any subdivision of the interval [0, 1]. We will prove the following results.

**Theorem 1.** Let  $f(x) \in C^2(-\infty, +\infty)$  with period 1. Let  $\varphi(x) \in C^2(-\infty, +\infty)$  be the cubic spline interpolating to f(x) at the joints (2.0) and having period 1. Then for all x

$$(2.1) \quad |\varphi^{(r)}(x) - f^{(r)}(x)| \leq 5\delta^{2-r} \cdot \max_{\|u-v\| \leq \delta} |f''(u) - f''(v)|, \qquad r = 0, 1, 2,$$

where

$$\delta = \max_{i} (x_i - x_{i-1}).$$

The estimate (2.1) remains valid if the periodicity of f(x) and  $\varphi(x)$  is replaced by the requirement

(2.2) 
$$\varphi'(0) = f'(0), \qquad \varphi'(1) = f'(1).$$

**Theorem 2.** Let  $f(x) \in C^3(-\infty, \infty)$  with period 1. For the joints (2.0), let K be such that

(2.3) 
$$\max_{i} (x_{i} - x_{i-1}) \leq K \min_{i} (x_{i} - x_{i-1}).$$

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
