## Inequalities Concerning the Modules of Curve Families

1. Introduction. Let A be the topological image of an n-cube in n-dimensional Euclidean space and v, w be nonnegative Lebesgue-integrable real-valued functions defined on A. Then

(\*) 
$$\int_{\operatorname{Int} A} vw \ dH^{n} \geq \left(\inf_{\Gamma} \int_{c} v \ dH^{1}\right) \left(\inf_{\Sigma} \int_{Q} w \ dH^{n-1}\right),$$

where c is an arc joining, and Q is a set separating, the images of a fixed pair of opposite sides of the n-cube, and  $H^k$  is the k-dimensional Hausdorff measure in n-space. (\*) was conjectured, for n=3, by R. J. Duffin [3] based on an analogous inequality for networks. Using (\*) one obtains, for arbitrary p>1, the module inequality

$$M_{\nu}(\Gamma)M_{\nu}(\Sigma) \geq 1$$
,

generalizing the identity

$$M_n(\Gamma)M_n(\Sigma) = 1,$$

due to Gehring [5] (for n = 3) and Ziemer [6].

## 2. Preliminaries.

2.1. Definitions. Let  $E^n$  denote Euclidean *n*-space, Bdry A, Int A, and Diam A, the boundary, interior, and diameter of a set A in  $E^n$  respectively,  $S_{\epsilon}(x) = \{y \text{ in } E^n : |x-y| < \epsilon\}$ ,  $I^n = [0, 1]^n$  the closed unit *n*-cube, and  $r_{xy}$  stands for the straight line segment from x to y.

A function  $f: E^n \to E^m$  is approximately differentiable at x if for some linear transformation  $D_{ap}f(x): E^n \to E^m$  and for every r > 0, the point x is a point of density of the set

$${x:|f(x+h)-f(x)-D_{ap}f(x)(h)| \leq r|h|}.$$
