Exact Multiplicative Functionals in Duality

1. Introduction. Let X and \hat{X} be standard Markov processes, with state space E, which are in duality relative to a σ -finite measure ξ . It was shown recently by Getoor [5] that if M is an exact multiplicative functional of X, there is a uniquely determined multiplicative functional \hat{M} of \hat{X} having the property that the associated resolvents $\{V^{\alpha}\}$ and $\{\hat{V}^{\alpha}\}$ are in duality, or that in a sense, the subprocesses (X, M) and (\hat{X}, \hat{M}) are in duality also. The correspondence is shown to be multiplicative, and by using methods generalizing those of Revuz ([10], [11]) a number of properties of the dual relationship are established for natural multiplicative functionals.

It is the purpose of the present paper to extend the results of Getoor [5] to the general case, and in so doing, we establish, as a major tool (Theorem 6.1), that every exact terminal time of X is a.s. of the form inf $\{t > 0 : (X_{t-}, X_t) \in \Gamma\}$, where Γ is a Borel subset of $E \times E$. This generalizes a result of Blumenthal and Getoor [1] which characterized the thin accessible terminal times of X as the hitting times of thin Borel sets.

In order to obtain these results, we study additive functionals of the processes which satisfy hypotheses a little weaker than the usual ones, but which are more appropriate for this situation as well as a number of others. These additive functionals are characterized, and by using the given characterization, it is found (Theorem 7.1) that the most general exact MF of X has the form

$$M_{t} = \prod_{s \le t} [1 - F(X_{s-}, X_{s})] 1_{[0,R)}(t) \exp \left\{ - \int_{0}^{t} f(X_{u}) dA_{u} \right\}$$

where R is an exact terminal time, $F \in (\mathcal{E} \times \mathcal{E})_+$, $f \in \mathcal{E}_+$, and A is an ordinary CAF of X. Using the general results on duality, one finds that the dual of M is obtained in the above form by replacing R by its dual, F(x, y) by $\widetilde{F}(x, y) = F(y, x)$, and A by its dual. The dual of $R = \inf\{t > 0 : (X_{t-}, X_t) \in \Gamma\}$ is $\widehat{R} = \inf\{t > 0 : (\widehat{X}_t, \widehat{X}_{t-}) \in \Gamma\}$ and the dual of A is the $CAF \widehat{A}$ of \widehat{X} having the same associated measure μ as A, so that $u_A^{\alpha} = U^{\alpha}\mu$ and $\hat{u}_A^{\alpha} = \mu \widehat{U}^{\alpha}$ (see Theorems 8.7 and 8.8 for details.)

In the final section, we discuss a duality theory for the more general additive functionals introduced here, extending the results of [6] in a special case.
