Slices and Potentials

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1. The operation of slicing an m dimensional normal current T in U by a locally Lipschitzian map f of U into \mathbb{R}^n , with $m \geq n$, was studied in [2, §3] and [3, §4.3] through relative differentiation of measures. It was shown that the slice $\langle T, f, y \rangle$ exists for \mathcal{L}^n almost all points y in \mathbb{R}^n , as an m-n dimensional flat chain in U, and is \mathfrak{L}^n summable with respect to y. Here it will be proved that the Hausdorff dimension of the exceptional set, consisting of those points y in \mathbb{R}^n for which $\langle T, f, y \rangle$ fails to exist, never exceeds n-1. The new method combines techniques from potential theory and geometric measure theory, and yields also a residue formula for slices.

We use the terminology of [3], which contains glossaries of basic notation on pages 669 to 671.

2. In this section we discuss a few facts which we need from potential theory. Suppose M is the set of all (nonnegative) Radon measures over \mathbb{R}^n with compact support. Whenever $\mu \in M$ and $0 < s < \infty$ the potential P^s_{μ} is given by the formula

$$P^*_{\mu}(y) = \int |z - y|^{-\epsilon} d\mu z \quad \text{for} \quad y \in \mathbb{R}^n,$$

where $0^{-\bullet} = \infty$. Letting

$$M^* = M \cap \{\mu: P^*_{\mu}(y) \leq 1 \text{ for } y \in \text{spt } \mu\},$$

we define the s dimensional capacity first for open subsets V of \mathbb{R}^n as

$$\operatorname{Cap}^{s}(V) = \sup \{ \mu(V) : \mu \in M^{s} \text{ and } \operatorname{spt} \mu \subset V \},$$

then for arbitrary subsets A of \mathbb{R}^n as

$$\operatorname{Cap}^*(A) = \inf \left\{ \operatorname{Cap}^*(V) : A \subset V \subset \mathbb{R}^n \text{ and } V \text{ is open} \right\}.$$

The following nine propositions hold:

(1) If V is an open subset of \mathbb{R}^n , then

$$\operatorname{Cap}^{s}(V) = \sup \{ \mu(V) : \mu \in M^{s} \}.$$

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
