## The Azumaya Algebra of Some Polynomial Closed Rings

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Introduction. In [4], F. DeMeyer studied the polynomial closure  $\Omega$  of a weakly uniform ring R. The polynomial closure  $\Omega$  is a locally separable subalgebra of the separable closure defined by G. Janusz in [5] when the ground ring has no idempotents except 0 and 1. This paper studies the finitely generated and projective modules and the Azumaya algebras over the polynomial closure  $\Omega$  of some kind of weakly uniform rings. It is proved that the Azumaya algebras over  $\Omega$  are split algebras in case the stalks of the Pierce sheaf defined on Spec B(R) are noetherian and semi-local (B(R)) = the set of idempotents of R, Spec B(R) = the set of maximal ideals with the hull-kernel topology); this extends Theorem 4 in [3]. Also, a finitely generated and projective  $\Omega$ -module is a finite direct sum of free  $\Omega e_i$ -modules where  $e_i$  are in B(R) with  $\sum_{i=1}^n e_i = 1$  and  $e_i e_i = 0$  for  $i \neq j$ ; this result extends the fact on page 377 in [1]. In the latter half, the cancellation laws of Azumaya algebras and projective modules over  $\Omega$  are proved.

Throughout we assume that R is a commutative ring with identity 1 and that all modules are unitary left modules over a ring or an algebra. Let B(R) be the set of idempotents of R and let  $\operatorname{Spec} B(R)$  be the set of maximal ideals in B(R) with the hull-kernel topology. This topology has a basis  $\{U_e\} = \{x/x \text{ in } \operatorname{Spec} B(R) \text{ and } 1 - e \text{ in } x \text{ for } e \text{ in } B(R)\}$ . Then it is totally disconnected, compact and Hausdorff. Also from [9], the Pierce sheaf of the stalks  $R_x = R/xR$  for x in  $\operatorname{Spec} B(R)$  is defined on  $\operatorname{Spec} B(R)$ , and R is the global cross section of this sheaf. We denote  $R_x \otimes_R M$  by  $M_x$  for an R-module M and x in  $\operatorname{Spec} B(R)$ . As given in [4], a strongly separable R-algebra is a finite projective and separable R-algebra. A ring R is a uniform ring if for each x in  $\operatorname{Spec} B(R)$  there is a collection of isomorphisms  $\phi_y : R_y \to R_x$  (y in  $\operatorname{Spec} B(R)$ ) such that if F is a finite subset of R there is a neighborhood U of x with  $\phi_y(a_y) = a_x$  for all a in F, y in U. A weakly uniform ring is a finite direct sum of uniform rings. A polynomial f(X) is called separable if it is monic and R[X]/(f(X)) is a separable
