Local Nondeterminism and Local Times of Gaussian Processes

1. Introduction. This work grew from a study of the general conditions under which a Gaussian process has a smooth local time function. It is shown here that the main calculation in our previous work on the local time (e.g., [1], [3], [4]) involves a property of Gaussian processes which is of independent interest—local nondeterminism. A process is locally nondeterministic if a future observation is "relatively unpredictable" on the basis of a finite set of observations from the immediate past. In other words, there is an unremovable element of "noise" in the local evolution of the sample function. We expect a random function with this property to be locally irregular. And so it is: We show that local nondeterminism is one of the two main sufficient conditions in our general result on the existence and smoothness of the local time of a general Gaussian process (Section 8). This in turn implies the local irregularity of the sample functions of the process.

Much of this paper is a systematic investigation of the conditions under which a Gaussian process is locally nondeterministic. Necessary and sufficient conditions are furnished in Section 2. These conditions are applied to various types of processes in Section 3. A major part of the work is devoted to the process with stationary increments (Sections 4–7): usable sufficient conditions are included in Sections 6 and 7.

The results of this study extend many of the sample function properties established in [1], [2], [3], [4] to more general kinds of processes.

2. Local nondeterminism: definition and characterizations. Throughout this paper X(t), $-\infty < t < \infty$, is a Gaussian process with mean 0. As is well known, the best (linear) predictor of the future value X(t+h), for h>0, based on the past data X(s), $-\infty < s \le t$, is the conditional expectation $E\{X(t+h) \mid X(s), -\infty < s \le t\}$. The prediction error of lag h is the conditional variance, Var $\{X(t+h) \mid X(s), -\infty < s \le t\}$. The process is nondeterministic if the latter is positive for h>0 (cf. [5], p. 107).
