Regularity of the Free Boundary of a Gas Flow in an n-dimensional Porous Medium

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1. Introduction. The density u(x,t) of gas in a porous medium satisfies the equation

$$\frac{\partial u}{\partial t} = \Delta u^m$$

for $x \in \mathbb{R}^n$, t > 0, where m is a given number, m > 1, and an initial condition

$$(1.2) u(x,0) = u_0(x)$$

for $x \in \mathbb{R}^n$. Here $u_0(x) \ge 0$ and $u(x,t) \ge 0$.

Since the equation (1.1) is a degenerate nonlinear parabolic equation, the concept of a regular solution is too restrictive. By a solution of (1.1), (1.2) we shall mean a function u(x,t) such that, for any $T < \infty$,

(1.3)
$$\int_0^T \int_{\mathbb{R}^n} \left[\left(u(x,t) \right)^2 + \left| \nabla_x u^m(x,t) \right|^2 \right] dx dt < \infty$$

and

(1.4)
$$\int_0^T \int_{\mathbb{R}^n} \left(u \frac{\partial f}{\partial t} - \nabla_x u^m \cdot \nabla_x f \right) dx dt + \int_{\mathbb{R}^n} u_0(x) f(x) dx = 0$$

for any continuously differentiable function f with compact support in $R^n \times [0, T)$.

We shall assume that

$$(1.5) 0 \le u_0(x) \le N (N < \infty),$$

$$(1.6) \qquad \int_{\mathbb{R}^n} \left(u_0(x)\right)^2 dx < \infty.$$

Under these conditions [9] there exists a unique solution of (1.1), (1.2) (in the sense of (1.3), (1.4)). Further, if $u_n(x,t)$ is the solution with

(1.7)
$$u_{\eta}(x,0) = u_{0}(x) + \eta, \quad \eta > 0,$$
