## Automorphisms of C\*-algebras and Second Čech Cohomology

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Let A be a  $C^*$ -algebra with identity, and let Aut A be the group of all \*-automorphisms of A endowed with the norm topology. In their systematic investigation [22] of Aut A, Kadison and Ringrose considered the subgroups Inn A,  $\gamma(A)$ ,  $\pi(A)$  of Aut A consisting of, respectively, inner automorphisms, those path-connected to the identity, and  $\pi$ -inner automorphisms. As well as proving some general theorems about the relationships between these subgroups, they investigated in detail some particular cases, including the algebra  $C(X, M_n(\mathbb{C}))$  of continuous functions from a compact space into the matrix algebra  $M_n(\mathbb{C})$ . Subsequently Lance [25] and Smith [32] considered the algebra A = C(X, B(H)), where X is compact and separable, and B(H)is the algebra of all operators on a Hilbert space H of dimension  $\aleph_0$ . They proved the striking result that  $\pi(A)/\gamma(A) \cong H^2(X,\mathbb{Z})$ , the second Čech cohomology group of X with integral coefficients. It follows from their results that in this case  $\pi(A)$  coincides with the group  $\operatorname{Aut}_{C(X)}A$  of automorphisms which preserve the C(X)-module structure of A, and that  $\gamma(A) = \text{Inn } A$ ; hence their theorem identifies the group  $\operatorname{Aut}_{C(X)}A/\operatorname{Inn}A$  of outer C(X)-automorphisms of A = C(X, B(H)) with  $H^2(X, \mathbb{Z})$ .

We shall extend the theorem of Lance and Smith to  $C^*$ -algebras of sections of bundles whose fibres are  $C^*$ -algebras. We consider two distinct types of bundles: the first have as fibre the algebra K(H) of compact operators on a Hilbert space H, and as structure group Aut K(H) equipped with the topology of pointwise convergence; the algebra  $A = \Gamma_0(E)$  of sections of such a bundle E over a locally compact space X is called a stable continuous trace  $C^*$ -algebra with spectrum X. We prove that if Inn A now denotes the group of automorphisms which are implemented by multipliers (this is consistent notation if A has identity), then there is a short exact sequence

$$0 \to \operatorname{Inn} A \to \operatorname{Aut}_{C_h(X)} A \stackrel{\neg}{\to} H^2(X, \mathbb{Z}) \to 0.$$

In fact, if A is any separable continuous trace  $C^*$ -algebra then we can construct the homomorphism  $\eta$ , but it is not necessarily surjective. The second type of bundle we consider has as fibre a  $C^*$ -algebra B with identity and structure group Inn B in its norm topology. If E is such a bundle over a
