## The Hardy-Littlewood Maximal Function on L(p,1)

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The Hardy-Littlewood maximal function of a locally integrable function, f, is

$$Mf(x) = \sup \frac{1}{|Q|} \int_{Q} |f(t)| dt,$$

the supremum taken over all cubes, Q, containing x. In a previous paper [1], we considered norm inequalities of the form

(1) 
$$||Mf||_{p\bar{q}} \le C||f||_{pq}, \quad 1$$

where

$$||f||_{pq} = \begin{cases} \left(q \int_0^\infty w(\{x \in \mathbf{R}^n : |f(x)| > y\})^{q/p} y^{q-1} dy\right)^{1/q}, & 1 \le q < \infty \\ \sup_{y > 0} y w(\{x \in \mathbf{R}^n : |f(x)| > y\})^{1/p}, & q = \infty \end{cases}$$

is a norm on the weighted Lorentz space L(p,q) = L(p,q;w(x)dx) for  $1 , <math>1 \le q \le \infty$ , and w non-negative and locally integrable.

Recall that  $w \in A_p$ , 1 , if there is a constant C so that

$$\left(\frac{1}{|Q|}\int_{Q}w(x)dx\right)\left(\frac{1}{|Q|}\int_{Q}w(x)^{1-p'}dx\right)^{p/p'}\leq C$$

for all cubes  $Q \subset \mathbb{R}^n$ , and  $w \in A(p,1)$  if for any cube Q and measurable set  $E \subset Q$ ,

$$\frac{|E|}{|Q|} \le C \left[ \frac{w(E)}{w(Q)} \right]^{1/p}.$$

In [1], it was shown that, for q > 1, (1) holds if and only if  $w \in A_p$  and, for q = 1 and  $\bar{q} = \infty$ , (1) is equivalent to  $w \in A(p,1)$ . Although it was also proved that  $w \in A_p$  implies (1) with  $\bar{q} = q$ , the strongest possible inequality, the equivalence when q = 1 and  $\bar{q} < \infty$ , was unresolved. It is interesting that for these
