Solutions of the Porous Medium Equation in \mathbf{R}^N under Optimal Conditions on Initial Values

Introduction. This paper concerns the initial-value problem

(IVP)
$$u_t = \Delta(|u|^{m-1}u) \quad \text{on } \mathbf{R}^N \times (0,T), m > 1,$$

$$u(x,0) = u_0(x), \quad x \in \mathbf{R}^N,$$

where the interval of existence [0,T), T > 0, depends on the initial data u_0 . We are interested in solving (IVP) for the largest possible class of functions u_0 . In fact, we will prove a nonlinear version of the result which states that the linear problem

(0.1)
$$u_t = \Delta u \quad \text{on } \mathbf{R}^N \times (0,T),$$
$$u(x,0) = u_0(x), \quad x \in \mathbf{R}^N$$

has a solution on some interval [0,T) if

(0.2)
$$\int |u_0(x)| e^{-c|x|^2} dx < \infty \quad \text{for some } c > 0.$$

(Of course, (0.2) guarantees that the solution formula for (0.1) provides a solution on [0,4/c).) If $u_0 \ge 0$ it is known that (0.2) is also *necessary* for (0.1) to have a solution $u \ge 0$ on some time interval [0,T), T > 0 [15].

Here we prove, without the aid of explicit solutions, that (IVP) has a solution on some interval [0,T) if

(0.3)
$$\sup_{R\geq 1} R^{-(N+2/(m-1))} \int_{\{|x|\leq R\}} |u_0(x)| dx < \infty,$$

or, equivalently (see the Appendix),

(0.3)'
$$\sup_{R\geq 1} \frac{1}{R^N} \int_{\{|x|\leq R\}} \frac{|u_0(x)|}{(1+|x|^2)^{1/(m-1)}} \, dx < \infty.$$
