## Local Norm Inequalities for Lacunary Series

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ABSTRACT. We prove some norm inequalities for lacunary trigonometric and Walsh series.

It is known that for lacunary trigonometric series  $f(x) = \sum c_k e^{in_k x}$  with  $n_{k+1}/n_k \ge q > 1$ , its  $L^2$  norm over  $[0, 2\pi]$  is equivalent to its  $L^p$  norm for any  $0 . It is also known (see [4]) that for any measurable set <math>E \subset [0,1]$ , |E| > 0, there exists N = N(E) so that if  $n_0 = 0, n_1 \ge N$ ,

$$\frac{1}{|E|} \int_{E} \left| \sum_{k=0}^{\infty} c_{k} e^{in_{k}x} \right|^{2} dx \sim \sum_{k=0}^{\infty} |c_{k}|^{2}.$$

A similar result holds for Rademacher series, and this result has been generalized to 0 in [2]. Rademacher series can be viewed as particularly nice lacunary Walsh series. Our purpose in this note is to generalize the result of [2] to lacunary series both in the context of Walsh and trigonometric functions.

The Rademacher functions are defined as follows:

$$\varphi_0(x) = \begin{cases} 1 & 0 \le x < \frac{1}{2} \\ -1 & \frac{1}{2} \le x < 1 \end{cases},$$

$$\varphi_0(x+1) = \varphi_0(x), \text{ and}$$

$$\varphi_k(x) = \varphi_0(2^k x), \qquad k = 1, 2, \dots$$

The Walsh functions, in Paley's ordering, are defined as

$$w_0(x) = 1, \ w_n(x) = \varphi_{a_1}(x)\varphi_{a_2}(x)\cdots\varphi_{a_\ell}(x),$$

where  $n = 2^{a_1} + 2^{a_2} + \dots + 2^{a_\ell}$  with integers  $a_1 > a_2 > \dots + a_\ell \ge 0$ .
