## An Application of a Parabolic Comparison Principle to Free Boundary Problems

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In this paper we obtain in a very simple manner free boundary regularity via a comparison principle for solutions of parabolic equations under the assumption that the solution is monotone in some spatial direction, thus extending the result of [2] to the parabolic case.

Although we can deal with more general situations, for simplicity, we consider the classical one-phase Stefan problem in a local setting, i.e., we are given a function u such that

(i) 
$$u(x,t) \ge 0$$
 in  $D_R := B_R(x_0) \times (t_0 - R^2, t_0 + R^2)$ , with  $(x_0, t_0) \in \partial \{u > 0\}$ ,

(ii)  $Hu := \Delta u - u_t = 1$  in  $D_R \cap \{u > 0\}$ ,

where  $B_R(x_0) = \{x \in \mathbb{R}_n : |x-x_0| < R\}$ . It is well known (see [3]) that  $u \in C_x^{1,1}(D_{R-\varepsilon}), u \in C_t^1(D_{R-\varepsilon})$  for any  $\varepsilon > 0$ . The extra assumption that in some spatial direction, say  $e_1$ , u is monotone (i.e.,  $D_{e_1}u \geq 0$ ) may be inferred in many cases from global situations. This implies that the free boundary can be represented as a graph of a function  $x_1 = f(x_2, ..., x_n, t)$ . By an argument due to H. W. Alt (see [1]) adapted to the parabolic case, one can show that in compact subsets of  $D_R$  there is a whole cone  $K(e_1, \vartheta) = \{\sigma \in \mathbb{R}^{n+1} : |\sigma| = 1, \sigma \cdot e_1 < \cos \vartheta\}$  of directions such that  $D_{\sigma}u \geq 0 \ \forall \sigma \in K(e_1, \vartheta)$ . Hence f is Lipschitz continuous.

We intend to prove the following:

**Theorem.** Let u be a solution of (i) and (ii) above. Suppose that  $D_{e_1}u \geq 0$  and f is a Lipschitz function. Then f is a  $C^{1,\alpha}$  function for some  $0 < \alpha < 1$ .

For the proof of the theorem we need a control of the gradient, as follows.

**Lemma 1.** Let  $(0,0) \in \partial \{u > 0\}$  and  $B_{2r}(0) \times (-4r^2, 4r^2) \subset D_R$ . Then there exist constants C > c > 0 depending only on the aperture of the cone  $K(e_1, \vartheta)$ , n,  $||u||_{C_x^{1,1}}$  and  $||u||_{C_t^0}$ ,  $||u||_{C_x^{1,1}}$  such that

$$c\sqrt{u(x,t)} \le |\nabla u(x,t)| \le C\sqrt{u(x,t)}$$

 $\forall (x,t) \in B_r(0) \times (-r^2, r^2), \text{ where } \nabla u = (\nabla_x u, u_t).$
