## On the Life Span of the Analytic Solutions to Quasilinear Weakly Hyperbolic Equations

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ABSTRACT. Consider the second order nonlinear Cauchy problem

$$u_{tt} = F(t, x, u, u_x, u_{xx}), \quad u(0, x) = \varepsilon \varphi(x), \quad u_t(0, x) = \varepsilon \psi(x)$$

assuming that it is weakly hyperbolic at  $u = u_x = u_{xx} = 0$  (i.e., the matrix  $F_{u_{ij}}(t,x,0,0,0)$  is nonnegative definite) and that F(t,x,0,0,0) = 0; assume moreover that F,  $\varphi$ ,  $\psi$  are real analytic in all their variables (possibly excepted t) and periodic in x: it is then known, by the Cauchy-Kowalewski theorem, that a local solution exists on some strip  $[0,T_{\varepsilon}] \times \mathbf{R}^n$ .

Here we prove that  $T_{\varepsilon} \to +\infty$  for  $\varepsilon \to 0$ . Moreover, in the autonomous case (F independent of t) we can give the estimate  $T_{\varepsilon} \geq \mu \log \log \left(\frac{1}{\varepsilon}\right)$ .

## 1. Introduction. Let us consider the initial value problem

(1) 
$$u_{tt} - \sum_{i,j}^{1,n} a_{ij}(t,x,u,u_x) u_{x_i x_j} = f(t,x,u,u_x) \qquad (t \ge 0)$$

(2) 
$$u(0,x) = \varepsilon \varphi(x), \quad u_t(0,x) = \varepsilon \psi(x)$$

where

$$(3) f(\cdot,\cdot,0,0) = 0.$$

Assume that the functions  $a_{ij}$ , f,  $\varphi$ ,  $\psi$  are continuous in t and analytic in all the other arguments; assume moreover that these functions are  $2\pi$ -periodic in  $x_1, \ldots, x_n$  (see, however, Remark 4 for the non periodic case).
