A Characterization of Generalized Complex Ellipsoids In \mathbb{C}^n and Related Results

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Introduction. Let D be a bounded domain in \mathbb{C}^n and x a point on the boundary ∂D . Assume that there is a local holomorphic peaking function for D at x, and that x is an accumulation point of an Aut(D)-orbit. Can we then determine the global structure of D from the local shape of the boundary ∂D near x? There are several papers closely related to this problem. For instance, Wong [30] and Rosav [26] investigated the case where x is a C^2 strictly pseudoconvex boundary point; Frankel [9] gave a characterization of bounded symmetric domains among the category of hyperbolic convex domains D in \mathbb{C}^n by using the so-called rescaling or blow-up technique at some boundary points. This technique of blow-up was later extended by Kim [14] to the case where D near x is locally biholmorphically equivalent to a C^{ω} convex domain. Moreover, a complete characterization of a bounded pseudoconvex domain in \mathbb{C}^2 with C^{ω} boundary and non-compact automorphism group can be found in Bedford and Pinchuk [1]. Bedford and Pinchuk [2] have some generalizations of this result to higher dimensions and to domains of finite type. More recently, Bedford and Pinchuk [3] have given a classification of convex domains with non-compact automorphism group. Also, Greene and Krantz [12, 13], Kodama [16, 17, 18] and Berteloot [4] studied the above problem in the case where D near x coincides with the complex ellipsoid

$$E(p_1, \ldots, p_n) = \left\{ z \in \mathbb{C}^n; \sum_{i=1}^n |z_i|^{2p_i} < 1 \right\},$$

where p_i are positive integers. In this paper, we shall study the structure of a generalized complex ellipsoid

$$E(n; n_1, \ldots, n_s; p_1, \ldots, p_s) = \left\{ (z_1, \ldots, z_s) \in \mathbb{C}^{n_1} \times \cdots \times \mathbb{C}^{n_s}; \sum_{i=1}^s ||z_i||^{2p_i} < 1 \right\}$$

in $\mathbb{C}^n = \mathbb{C}^{n_1} \times \cdots \times \mathbb{C}^{n_s}$, where p_1, \ldots, p_s are positive numbers and n_1, \ldots, n_s are positive integers, and $n = n_1 + \cdots + n_s$. In general this domain is not geometrically convex and its boundary is not smooth.
