## The Range of the Complex Monge-Ampère Operator

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ABSTRACT. We discuss the Dirichlet problem for the complex, non-homogeneous Monge-Ampère equation, finding some sufficient conditions for the right hand side to be the Monge-Ampère mass of a bounded plurisubharmonic function.

**Introduction.** We study the range of the complex Monge-Ampère operator  $u \to (dd^c u)^n$  acting on bounded plurisubharmonic functions which are defined in a strictly pseudoconvex subset of  $\mathbb{C}^n$ . For such functions,  $(dd^c u)^n$  is by [BT1] a (well defined) Borel measure. This measure is always dominated by the relative capacity of Bedford and Taylor (see [BT2], [B]),

$$\operatorname{cap}(E,\Omega) = \sup \left\{ \int_E (dd^c u)^n, \ u \in \operatorname{PSH}(\Omega), \ -1 < u < 0 \right\}.$$

If -M < u < 0, then obviously

$$\int_{E} (dd^{c}u)^{n} \leq M^{n} \mathrm{cap}(E, \Omega).$$

Thus, in particular,  $(dd^cu)^n$  is zero on pluripolar sets. However, the inequality

is not sufficient to ensure the existence of  $u \in \mathrm{PSH}(\Omega) \cap L^{\infty}(\Omega)$  such that

$$(0.2) (dd^c u)^n = d\mu$$

(see Example 2 in the last section). One would like to find a characterization of the image of the set of bounded plurisubharmonic functions through the Monge-Ampère operator.

A softer problem, but also open, is the following: Whether the existence of a subsolution  $v \in \mathrm{PSH}(\Omega) \cap L^{\infty}(\Omega)$  with  $(dd^cv)^n \geq d\mu$  implies the existence of u satisfying (0.2)? (see [B], [CK], [CP], [CS]).
