1. Introduction. Consider a scalar radiation field, described by a function U, which satisfies

$$\Delta U + k^2 U = 0$$

with positive real k outside a certain finite region G. Let this function U satisfy the Sommerfeld radiation conditions. This function then may be regarded as being generated by volume sources, surface sources, or point singularities, all of which are inside G.

The radiation pattern of the field is then given by the asymptotic behavior of the function U at infinity. The object of this paper is to investigate the relation between the radiation pattern and the function U. We shall prove first that when we introduce spherical coordinates $(x) = R(\xi)$, any function which has the properties mentioned above satisfies, for $R \to \infty$, an asymptotic relation
