The Time-Dependent Solution for a Storage Model with Poisson Input

Summary. This paper is concerned with the time-dependent distribution function F(z, t) of the content of an infinite dam, fed by a Poisson input and with a steady continuous release ceasing only when it becomes empty.

The forward Kolmogorov relation for F(z, t) is a known difference-differential equation. By obtaining the probabilities of first emptiness of the dam, it is possible to find the probability F(0, t) that the dam is empty after a period of time t, not necessarily for the first time.

This is finally used to solve the forward equation for F(z, t) directly; the known stationary distribution of the dam content can then be derived as the limit of F(z, t) when $t \to \infty$.

1. Introduction. In a recent note [1] and paper [2], the authors have discussed an infinite storage model, usually thought of as a dam, whose content $Z(t) \ge 0$ is defined in continuous time t ($0 \le t < \infty$) by the equation

(1)
$$Z(t + \delta t) = Z(t) + \delta X(t) - \min \{Z(t), \delta t\}.$$

In this, X(t) represents the input into the dam during time t, a Poisson process with parameter λ , such that in a small interval of time δt the quantity $\delta X(t) = 0$ or h may be added to the dam content. The distribution function (d.f.) of the input X(t) is given by

$$K(x, t) = \sum_{r=0}^{\lfloor x/h \rfloor} e^{-\lambda t} \frac{(\lambda t)^r}{r!} ,$$

and it is clear from its Laplace-Stieltjes transform,

$$\int_{x=0}^{\infty} e^{-\theta x} dK(x, t) = \exp \left\{-\lambda t (1 - e^{-\theta h})\right\} = \exp \left\{-t \xi(\theta)\right\},\,$$

that inputs are additive, being independently distributed in non-overlapping
