## On Nonlinear Ordinary Differential Equations Containing a Parameter

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**0.** Introduction. We shall present a method of solving a system of differential equations of the type

(A) 
$$\epsilon^{\sigma} \frac{dy}{dx} = f(x, y, \epsilon),$$

where  $\sigma$ ,  $\epsilon$ , x and y are a positive integer, a complex parameter, a complex variable and an n-dimensional vector, respectively. One norm of a vector y is given by

$$||y|| = \max\{|y_i|; j = 1, 2, \dots, n\},\$$

where  $y_i$ ,  $j=1, \dots, n$ , are the components of y. Each component of the n-dimensional vector f is assumed to be holomorphic in all its arguments in a region defined by

(B) 
$$|x| \leq \delta_0$$
,  $|y| \leq \delta'_0$ ,  $0 < |\epsilon| \leq \rho_0$ ,  $|\arg \epsilon| \leq \alpha_0$ ,

where  $\delta_0$  ,  $\delta_0'$  ,  $\rho_0$  and  $\alpha_0$  are all positive constants. In addition, we shall suppose that f admits for

(C) 
$$|x| \leq \delta_0$$
,  $|y| \leq \delta'_0$ 

a uniformly asymptotic expansion

(D) 
$$f(x, y, \epsilon) \simeq \sum_{k=0}^{\infty} \hat{f}_k(x, y) \epsilon^k$$

as  $\epsilon$  tends to zero through the region

(E) 
$$0 < |\epsilon| \le \rho_0$$
,  $|\arg \epsilon| \le \alpha_0$ .

The coefficients  $\hat{f}_k$  are assumed to be holomorphic in (C).

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
